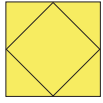
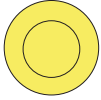


# Inscribed & Concentric Figures

aka Circles, Squares and Triangles  
aka Superimposed (Ornamental) Geometric Shapes



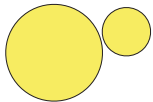
INSCRIBED comes from the Latin meaning “written within” and is a figure within a figure touching the edges in as many places as possible.



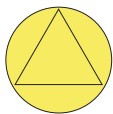
CONCENTRIC is to have a common center.



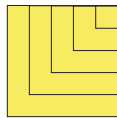
ALIGNED is to adjust or to form a line.



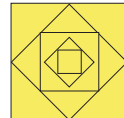
TANGENT is to touch at a single point.



CIRCUMSCRIBED is to be around the circumference of the smaller shape.
